What Do You Want To Do?

- » Raise quality / Increase coverage
- » Release faster
- » Hit high-value targets
- » Is automation valuable?

These are business decisions



How Are You Going To Do It?

- » What kind of testing?
 - › Feature
 - › Lock-step with Agile/Scrum/Etc.
 - › Integration/End-to-end
 - › Exploratory
 - › Performance
 - › Some or all of the above
- » Are your test cases “automation ready”?
- » “Date or Marry?”

 - › Have any friendlies?




Studio Audience or Home Audience?

- » Language (not *that* kind)




How Are Your Relationships?



Why Are You Telling Me This?

- » Relationships affect behavior
- » Good relationships → trust and dialog
- » Allows culture change
- » The middle can facilitate change
- » Increases tool choices

What Are You Testing?

- » Product status
 - › New
 - › Existing and adding new features/fixes
 - › “Legacy” and migrating to new tech/arch
- » Product type
 - › Desktop? Mobile? Web? Combination?
 - › Distributed system
 - › Embedded
- » Product automatability
 - › Messaging
 - › API
 - › GUI
 - › Which tech?



What Is Your Test Bed?

- » Desktop? Laptop? Lab? Segregated LAN?
- » Which OS or OS combination?
- » Virtual environments
- » Devices, specialty or proprietary hardware



With What Do You Interact?

- » Test script repository
- » Results repository
- » Continuous integration environment
- » The cloud
- » License server



How Big Is Your Box?

- » Network/Security
- » Intellectual property
- » HIPAA/PCI/etc.
- » Budget
 - › Buy
 - › Build
 - › Open source



I'd Like To Solve The Puzzle

Company 1

- » Web, services, thick client
- » Greenfield with needs
- » What (not) to automate
- » Small user base
- » Small number of products
- » Multi-browser/OS/Mobile
- » Jenkins
- » MTM – run and results

Company 2

- » Web, services, thick client
- » Existing infrastructure with needs
- » What (not) to automate
- » Larger, mixed user base
- » Large number of products
- » Windows/IE/.NET
- » Team City




Really?

- » No
- » Context
- » OK to learn about tools
- » Don't prematurely decide
- » Automation tool as “boss card”?

Best In Class



- » Consider instead: Most Appropriate In Class
- » The “best” isn’t always what is needed
- » “Best” is relative; remember the burgers
- » Start with appropriate, evolve when no longer appropriate

Solving The “Company 1” Puzzle

- » Unclear technology roadmap
- » Needed web testing via the browser
- » Looked at several tools; at the time:
 - › Vendor-supplied not cost effective
 - › Selenium RC and IDE not appropriate
 - › Selenium WebDriver not ready
- » Layered framework with Ruby scripting for tool independence
- » Started with WebSpec, migrated to Selenium WebDriver
 - › No impact to business logic
- » Eventually needed web services and ancillary capabilities



Solving The “Company 2” Puzzle

- » Unclear technology roadmap across many products
- » Needed web, non-web UI, and non-traditional automation
- » Existing initiative using TestComplete, evolution needed
- » Tool-*dependent*, layered architecture with scripting
- » Supplement with open source and automation assist



Free Spin?

- » Scrum teams adopt a test-first approach
- » New participants in automation creation
 - › Testers
 - › Developers – already know C#
 - › Product owners
- » Selenium has attractive licensing
- » Layered framework with scripting for tool independence
- » SpecFlow for “non-technical” audience
- » Coexists with TestComplete



What Do I Suggest?

- » Broad assessment of your ecosystem
- » “Play” with open source or free-trial tools
- » Prototype with appropriate tools and assess
- » Next steps...
 - › Re-prototype?
 - › Abstract away tool specifics in a framework?
 - › Develop a small sanity/smoke suite and reassess?
 - › Deeper assessment of ecosystem?



Takeaways

- » Focus on testing ecosystem
 - › Strategy, audience, environment
- » No premature decision
- » “Playing” is encouraged
- » Remember “Most Appropriate In Class”
