

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Defining Business Testers

- What is a Business Tester?
- Business Testers are:
 - a representative seconded from a business division of the company;
 - who may or may not be part of the project team;
 - who are brought in to test the product;
 - and are likely not a professional tester.





Who are our Business Testers?

• Business testers may be seconded from:

- Business end users
- Subject matter experts
- Super users
- Call centers
- Technical support
- Co-op students / Interns
- Managers / Leads
- Others?

Fact 1 – Are Not Testers

Challenges

- Likely do not understand or are uninterested in understanding testing approaches, terms, or practices;
- Likely do not think like a tester;
- May not appreciate the complexity of testing or may be intimidated by it.

- Business testers have unique domain knowledge.
- Exercise the system the same way they do everyday.



Fact 2 – Do Not Want to be Testers

Challenges

- Have a full time career in their business domain;
- Likely do not want to be trained to be testers;
- Likely view their role as a business tester for the project as a temporary assignment.

- To be successful you do not need to train them to be testers;
- They bring a business perspective and experience to the team;
- Share a common language that they understand.



Fact 3 – Require Guidance and Support

Challenges

- Will require guidance for:
 - Scope
 - Approach
 - Execution
- Will require ongoing support and encouragement.

- Great opportunity to see how your business users use the software.
- Gain unique insight into the expectations for your software.



Fact 4 – Require Expectation Management

• Challenges

- Quality, stability or issues they see in the product
- May become overwhelmed about:
 - Amount of work there is to perform testing
 - Complexity of testing
 - About the time requirements for testing and having to work their full time job

- Remind them that they are part of the team to help find problems.
- Set and manage expectations.
- Work closely with their managers and leadership to free up their time when testing deadlines are near.



Fact 5 – May Still Have a Full Time Job

Challenges

- Constant distractions
- Likely are not 100% allocated
- May still need to provide ongoing support to their team
- May be committed to other work
- Likely do not report to you or the project manager

Considerations

- Work to clarify the role and project allocation up front
- Expectations for channels of communication when pulled away for other assignments
- Be realistic about other commitments
- Learn to influence rather than manage





Setting the Team up for Success


- Remember business testers are not testers.

 - Set the direction
 - Build & communicate the plan
 - Give them ongoing guidance and support
 - Coach to success
